NOVATO HIGH SCHOOL HVAC UPGRADE AND FIRE ALARM PROJECT NOTICE OF EXEMPTION DISCUSSION

Project Description

Existing Conditions

The Novato High School, located at 625 Arthur Street in Novato is owned and operated by the Novato Unified School District. The school is in a single-family residential neighborhood, with houses directly adjacent to the school on Buchanan Street to the east, Arthur Street to the north and Van Buren Court to the south.

Proposed Project

The project would consist of fire alarm and HVAC upgrades at Buildings 1000 and 2800, and fire alarm upgrades on all of the other school buildings with the exception of Buildings 4000 and 1900, which would just be re-connected to the upgraded system.

The project would be constructed from June 15 to August 13, 2026.

No other construction on the school grounds or buildings is proposed as part of this project.

The purpose of the project would be to upgrade climate-control and fire safety facilities at the school to ensure a safe and comfortable educational environmental for students and faculty.

Categorical Exemption Analysis

Class 1 Exemption

The CEQA Class 1 Exemption for Existing Facilities (Guidelines, Section 15301) applies to the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing, or minor alteration of existing public or private structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features, involving negligible or no expansion of existing or former use. The key consideration is whether the project involves negligible or no expansion of use.

The project would consist of mechanical and electrical upgrades of existing buildings at the school. It would not affect school capacity and would not add any classrooms.

Exceptions Discussion

Per CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2, exceptions to this categorical exemption can apply where the following occur:

- Cumulative impact of the same type in the same place, over time is significant.
- Significant effect due to unusual circumstances.

- Damage to scenic resources, including but not limited to, trees, historic buildings, rock outcroppings, or similar resources, within a state scenic highway.
- Hazardous Waste Sites included on any list compiled pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.
- A substantial adverse change in the significance of a historical resource.

As summarized below, none of these exceptions appear to apply to this project and therefore this exemption would apply:

- The project area is a developed residential neighborhood, and no cumulative development is likely to occur nearby. No other projects are proposed at the school with possible concurrent construction. In addition, the proposed project's impacts would be less than cumulatively considerable, and there would be no potential for cumulatively considerable impacts.
- Construction would be repainting and exterior repairs to existing structures, which would not change the exterior appearances of the buildings. Therefore, this impact would be non-significant.
- The site is not on or near a listed hazardous waste site (database search performed December 15:, 2025

- The project would not change the building exteriors other than HVAC upgrades and fire alarm work. It would not demolish or substantially alter any historic structures. Therefore no historic resources would be affected.
- The project is at a fully developed school and there are not any unusual circumstances that could result in significant environmental impacts at the site.

General Rule Exemption

Where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to environmental review. In such cases, the activity is covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects that have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. (See CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3)). As described above, the project does not have the potential to result in a significant impact to the physical environment. Therefore this exemption would apply.
