1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 PM.

2. Public Open Time

Three members of the public addressed the Commission on items not on the agenda.

3. Consideration of the Draft Meeting Minutes of February 9, 2026

One member of the public provided comment. A motion was made by Commissioner Chan and seconded by Commissioner Oldham Robinett to approve the February 9, 2026 meeting minutes. The motion passed.

4. Announcements and Ad Hoc Subcommittee Reports

- a. Update on Correspondence Regarding Flock Safety Automated License Plate Readers - Vice Chair McEvoy reported that correspondence was received from community members expressing concerns about the County's use of Flock Safety automated license plate readers. Leadership will consider agendaizing the topic for a future meeting.
- b. Update on Letter of Invitation to the Sheriff - Vice Chair McEvoy reported that following the Commission's approval of a formal invitation requesting a presentation on the Sheriff's "Citizen Complaint Process," the Sheriff conveyed appreciation for the invitation and indicated he prefers to attend after the Inspector General is appointed.
- c. Update on Inspector General Hiring - Staff reported that a background check is underway for the preferred candidate. The process is anticipated to take approximately six to eight weeks.
- d. Monitoring and Compliance Ad Hoc Subcommittee - The Subcommittee reported meeting on February 17 and February 23, 2026, to begin developing a compliance monitoring framework and to review the State Criminal Alien Assistance Program (SCAAP) as an initial focus area. After discussion and review of preliminary materials, the Subcommittee determined additional information is needed and agreed to pause further work on SCAAP until the Inspector General is appointed.
- e. Community Outreach and Engagement Ad Hoc Subcommittee - The Subcommittee reported meeting on February 12 and February 26, 2026. Members advanced a

proposed informal Commission name for inclusion in the Bylaws and prepared a Draft Community Outreach and Engagement Plan for Commission review.

- f. Bylaws and Code of Conduct Ad Hoc Subcommittee - The Subcommittee reported meeting on February 24, 2026, to review public and Commissioner feedback on draft Bylaws and to discuss key provisions including terms, removal procedures, public comment guidelines, meeting frequency, and agenda-setting processes. The Subcommittee will continue its review and begin consideration of a draft Code of Conduct.

Three members of the public provided comment. The Commission received updates and took no formal action other than to receive the reports.

5. Consideration of a Draft Community Outreach and Engagement Plan

The Commission reviewed the Draft Community Outreach and Engagement Plan developed by the Community Outreach and Engagement Ad Hoc Subcommittee. One member of the public provided comment.

Commissioners expressed appreciation for the Subcommittee's work and provided feedback and suggested refinements. The Subcommittee will incorporate input and return with a revised draft at a future meeting. The Commission took no formal action on this item.

6. Consideration of a Draft Training Curriculum

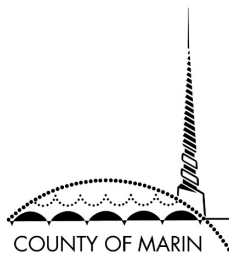
The Commission reviewed the Draft Training Curriculum intended to guide Commissioner training consistent with Ordinance 3824. Four members of the public provided comment.

Commissioners discussed proposed orientation topics, coordination with the Sheriff's Office, and future collaboration with the incoming Inspector General. The Subcommittee will incorporate feedback and return with a revised draft for further consideration. The Commission took no formal action on this item.

7. Adjournment

A motion to adjourn was made by Commissioner Oldham Robinett and seconded by Commissioner Gaston. The meeting was adjourned.

RECOMMENDATION:

Discuss the timing and approach for a potential future review of Flock Safety ALPR, consistent with the Commission’s adopted workplan.

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SUMMARY:

Members of the Commission have identified the use of Flock Safety Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) systems as an area of concern for potential future review. This item provides an opportunity for Commissioners to discuss timing, approach, and potential next steps, consistent with its adopted Workplan and oversight responsibilities.

POLICY FRAMEWORK:

Section 2.37.020(7) of [Ordinance 3824](#) outlines the Civilian Oversight Commission’s duties to, with the advice, assistance, and support of the Office of the Inspector General, develop and carry out a system and process to actively and continually monitor, report, and issue recommendations regarding Marin County Sheriff’s Office compliance with applicable policies, procedures, training, practices, and governing laws.

The [Commission’s adopted Workplan](#) further identifies subcommittees as the primary mechanism for reviewing specific policy topics and developing recommendations.

BACKGROUND:

Flock Safety ALPR systems - Last month, the Commission received community correspondence raising concerns about the Sheriff Office’s use of Flock Safety ALPR. The Commission acknowledged this correspondence at its March 9, 2026 meeting and indicated that the topic may be considered for a future agenda.

Engagement with the Sheriff’s Office - The Commission has initiated outreach to the Marin County Sheriff’s Office to support engagement on oversight-related topics. In February 2026, the Commission formally invited the Sheriff to present on its “[Citizen Complaint Process](#),” and staff subsequently extended an invitation for participation at a Monitoring and Compliance Ad Hoc Subcommittee meeting regarding the State Criminal Alien Assistance Program (SCAAP).

In both instances, the Sheriff expressed appreciation for the invitations but indicated a preference to defer participation in Commission meetings until after the appointment of the Inspector General.

DISCUSSION:

Given this context, the Commission may wish to discuss timing, approach, and potential next steps. This item is intended to support an initial Commission-level discussion and does not propose formal action.

EQUITY IMPACT SECTION:

The use of ALPR technology may have implications for communities of color, immigrant communities, and other historically over-surveilled populations. A future review could include consideration of data privacy, civil liberties, and disparate impacts, as well as opportunities for community engagement.
