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I. Executive Summary

Inmar Rx Solutions, Inc. (“Inmar”) was approved to operate a Drug Stewardship Program (“Program”) on December 21, 2021 pursuant to the Marin County Safe Drug Disposal Ordinance, Marin County Code Chapter 7.90.010 – 7.90.160 (“Ordinance”). This Annual Report is for the period between January 1, 2025 and December 31, 2025 (“Reporting Period”). All capitalized terms not defined in this summary are the same as those used in Inmar’s approved Drug Stewardship Plan (“Plan”) dated October 18, 2021, as revised November 16, 2021.

Throughout the Reporting Period, Inmar collected Unwanted Covered Drugs by means of Drop-Off Sites (Kiosks), two collection events and Mail-back Services including Standard Mail-Back Envelope Distribution Sites, as well as by request via Inmar’s Program website or toll-free phone number.

Inmar’s focus for the Reporting Period as stated in the goals section of the Plan was to increase collection weights, expand Mail-Back Services, and expand drop-off opportunities to provide convenient and equitable access as dictated by Ordinance Sec. 7.90.080(B)(1).

Inmar supplemented Drop-Off Sites by operating Standard Mail-Back Envelope Distribution Sites and completing two take-back events. At the end of the Reporting Period, Inmar operated two Kiosks and 47 Standard Mail-Back Envelope Distribution Sites for a total of 49 locations. Inmar collected Drop-Off Site Liners from two Kiosks for a total of 20 Drop-Off Site Liners and 706 pounds of Unwanted Covered Drugs and two Drop-Off Site Liners from Collection Events totaling 53 pounds of Unwanted Covered Drugs. There were 459 returned Mailers for a total of 172.45 pounds. Total weight collected in 2025 was 931.45 pounds of Unwanted Covered Drugs. This Annual Report mirrors the requirements outlined in Section 7.90.110 of the Ordinance.

A. Collection Points

Table 1 in Appendix B lists each of Inmar's Drop-Off Sites in Marin County as well as the weight collected from each Drop-Off Site and the corresponding number of Drop-Off Site Liners collected. The number of Drop-Off Site Liners in the column titled "Liners Collected" is indicative of the number of times the product was picked up from each location.

Inmar participated in two collection events during the Reporting Period. The first event was at the Marin County Senior Fair on Wednesday, September 17, 2025. This event was in partnership with OD Free Marin and Marin County Sheriff's Office. The second event was at the Marinwood Fire Department with the Marin County Sheriff's Office on November 5, 2025. The corresponding weight collected at each event is listed in the table below.

B. Standard Mail-Back Envelope Distribution Sites

Table 2 in Appendix B lists each participating Standard Mail-Back Envelope Distribution Site. Each of these sites was provided with Standard Mail-Back Envelopes, totaling 2,750 envelopes. During the Reporting Period, Inmar distributed 178 Standard Mail-Back Envelopes, 19 Inhaler Mail-Back Packages, and 41 Auto-Injector Mail-Back Packages from requests received via the Program website. Seven Standard Mail-Back Envelopes were requested via the toll-free phone number. Inmar collected a total of 172.45 pounds from 459 Mailers during the Reporting Period.

While Inmar does not collect health or accessibility status due to privacy considerations, our Program allows for direct mailer requests by any resident, thereby ensuring access is equitable and inclusive, consistent with the intent of Ordinance §7.90.110.4. Inmar has home-care organizations enrolled in the Mail-Back Program to provide disabled or home-bound County residents with Mail-Back Services.

VII. Educational Efforts and Public Outreach

Ordinance Sec. 7.90.110.9: A description of the public education, outreach and evaluation activities implemented during the reporting period;

A. Educational Materials

In accordance with Ordinance Section 7.90.100 Inmar provided easily-consumable educational materials for distribution to County residents including pharmacies, health care facilities, veterinary facilities, and other interested parties for dissemination to County residents at no charge. Education materials included standardized disposal instructions for Collectors of Unwanted Covered Drugs and Mail-Back Services, an educational brochure that includes tips for safe storage, where and how to dispose of Unwanted Covered Drugs. Additionally, Inmar hosted a Program website and toll-free phone number for County residents to visit and call to order mail-back materials as well as inquire about general Program operations. All materials are easily understandable with varying levels of English proficiency and leverage explanatory graphics to aid in understanding. Materials are available in English and Spanish.

B. Outreach Activities

Inmar administered the following outreach activities during the Reporting Period:

1. Digital Media - Programmatic

Programmatic media provides targeted display ads on browser sites on internet capable devices (smartphones, computers, tablets, etc.). Inmar ran ads across a prequalified list of over 200,000 domains including a variety of retail websites, Google, and Facebook. Inmar ran three separate programmatic campaigns. Two of the three programmatic campaigns promoted general awareness of the Program and ran for six weeks leading up to the DEA's National Prescription Take Back Days in October and April. The third programmatic campaign ran from September 2, 2025 through the lead-up to the Marin County Senior Fair. Designed to raise awareness of Inmar's medication take-back event, the campaign included a link directing users to additional information. Impression metrics are reported directly from the individual websites that the ads are placed on and are reported on a per campaign basis. The three programmatic campaigns garnered a total of 650,261 impressions. Examples of the programmatic ads are in Appendix F - Figure(s) 2 & 6.

As an event exhibitor at the Marin County Senior Fair, Inmar's advertisement along with the Program website information is displayed on the official Marin County Senior Fair website for one year. A copy of the images can be found in Appendix F - Figure(s) 5.

2. Digital Media - Influencer Marketing and Social Media

Influencer marketing is a content creation tactic used to drive awareness and education to a targeted audience through blogs and social media outlets. Influencers create authentic content around their everyday lives and interests while weaving the story of prescription drug take-back into their content. Influencer content is converted into paid ad

units across social platforms and then targeted to community members across Marin County.

Paid advertisements for influencer content were run on a variety of platforms including Google, Instagram and Facebook and drove towards a specified impression goal. Inmar ran several social media influencer campaigns concurrently with other traditional and digital media campaigns. Inmar posted two social media posts per month per platform (Instagram, Twitter, and Facebook) for a total of 72 posts.

Influencer campaigns were deployed every quarter for a total of four influencer campaigns in English and Spanish. Influencer campaigns in Marin County garnered a total of 20,527,000 impressions. Images used in the influencer campaigns are included in Appendix F - Figure(s) 1. The dates and results of each campaign are listed in Appendix F - Table 1.

In preparation for the Marin County Senior Fair, Inmar partnered with the Marin County Sheriff's Office to promote the event. The Sheriff's office promoted Inmar's advertisement encouraging followers to attend the event. A copy of the image can be found in Appendix F - Figure(s) 5.

3. Radio

Inmar utilized radio station KOIT 96.5 FM ("KOIT") to provide information on safe drug disposal throughout the listening area. KOIT is consistently one of the top stations in Marin County and the Bay Area radio market. Messaging also ran simulcast across streaming platforms. The radio ads started the week of September 29, 2025, and ran through December 21, 2025 for a total of 12 weeks (excluding the week of Thanksgiving). There were a total of 52 advertisements and the ads were 15 seconds in length. KOIT 96.5 FM Radio utilized optimization tactics throughout the campaign to deliver the advertisement during heavier listening times to garner more impressions. Advertisements focused on providing education on safe drug disposal and directed listeners to find more information on the Program website. Ads emphasized that safe drug disposal options are free to all County residents.

Inmar has insight into the scope of the outreach by identifying total impressions. During the duration of the 12-week radio campaign, Inmar was able to reach 951,600 listeners. The total number of impressions is calculated by determining the number of listeners for each advertisement that was deployed and is reported directly from the radio station.

4. Newspaper

In preparation for the Marin County Senior Fair, Inmar placed an advertisement in the Marin Independent Journal (MIJ), who was the official event promoter, the Sunday prior to the event. As reported by the MIJ, Sundays have the highest viewership. The one-quarter-page advertisement promoted the take-back event at the Senior Fair. Between the print and e-edition, the advertisement reached over 43,000 County residents as reported by MIJ, in addition to the estimated 5,000 official fair programs that are

handed out at the event. Additionally, The MIJ mailed the Senior Fair program to over 27,000 County residents the Sunday prior to the event. The advertisement was also displayed on MIJ's website from September 1 - September 18. This advertisement garnered an additional 50,000 viewers and can be seen in Appendix F - Figure 7.

5. Direct Mail

Inmar executed three direct mail campaigns in 2025. For the two general awareness campaigns, Inmar sent 10,000 direct mail postcards to County residents. The third campaign promoted the collection event at the Marinwood Fire Department on November 5, 2025. There were 1,500 direct mailers sent to County residents - 50% sent to West Marin and 50% sent to San Rafael resident homes. A copy of the direct mail postcards can be found in Appendix F - Figure(s) 3.

6. Targeted Email Campaign

In preparation for the November 5 take-back event at the Marinwood Fire Department in conjunction with Marin County Sheriff's Office, Inmar launched a targeted email campaign to 10,000 County residents promoting the event and Program website.

VIII. Recycling

Ordinance Sec. 7.90.110.10: A description of how collected packaging was recycled to the extent feasible, including the recycling facility or facilities used;

DEA § 1317.75(c) prohibits handling substances after they have been deposited into a kiosk. For this reason, Inmar is unable to separate and recycle drug packaging. Inmar will, however, execute educational programs, as outlined in Section VII, to encourage County residents to separate Unwanted Covered Drugs from their packaging and recycle the packaging prior to disposal.

Even though regulations prevent us from recycling drug packaging, Inmar has an interest in reducing waste and improving our environment. Through its Rx Returns and related business lines, Inmar has saved over 20,000 barrels of oil, recovered over 11,000 megawatts of clean energy, and powered over 900 homes in the past two years alone. We will continue to look for opportunities to expand our eco-friendly efforts in the County.

IX. Stewardship Plan Goals

A. Program Collection Goals

In accordance with Ordinance § 7.90.100(A), the shared website (www.medtakebackmarin.org) and phone number (844-482-5322) went live on May 30, 2023. Additionally, Inmar updated educational materials and signage on all kiosks to reflect the new shared website and phone number.

Inmar's long-term goal going into the Reporting Period is to increase overall collection opportunities by increasing Drop-Off Sites, Standard Mail-Back Envelope Distribution Sites and collection events to provide convenient and equitable access as dictated by Ordinance § 7.90.080(B)(1).

In an effort to meet that goal, Inmar revitalized Mail-Back Services and continually worked to provide take-back events as a means of expanding drop-off opportunities. Additionally, based on the Notification received from Marin County Environmental Health Services in the 2024 Reporting Period, Inmar has continued improved touchpoints and the contracting process for Standard Mail-Back Envelope Distribution Sites, clearly outlining the Program expectations and their roles and responsibilities as a Distribution Site. This effort resulted in an overall increase in requested and returned Mailers. The table below highlights the significant growth of the Mail-Back Program between 2023 and 2025. Note - The number requested is only indicative of resident requests and does not include requests for Mailers from Standard Mail-Back Envelope Distribution Sites.

The number of available pharmacies that are not already contracted by an existing Program Operator is very limited. Inmar has contacted all potential Drop-Off Sites for potential placement. Inmar continues to monitor for new pharmacies in an attempt to place additional kiosks.

During the Reporting Period, Inmar conducted outreach to household hazardous waste (HHW) facilities throughout Marin County to promote Mail-Back Services and pursue partnerships supporting the collection of Covered Drugs at one-day HHW take-back events countywide. Inmar successfully engaged with Zero Waste Marin and established a partnership to collect unwanted Covered Drugs at future one-day take-back events hosted throughout the County in 2026.

B. Program Promotion Goals

Inmar continued influencer and social media outreach throughout 2025. Social media posts consisted of two posts per month per platform (Instagram, Twitter, and Facebook). Inmar ran four Influencer campaigns throughout the year starting in March 2025 and ending in December 2025, each campaign running six weeks in length. All four quarters garnered a total of 20,527,000 impressions.

Inmar met long-term goals by continuously updating kiosk and Standard Mail-Back Envelope Distribution Site lists, continuing the social influencer and social media outreach initiatives both monthly and quarterly, and completing targeted media outreach. Targeted media was completed in the form of emails and direct mail. Traditional media outreach consisted of radio and newspaper. Detailed descriptions and impact measurement of each activity can be found in section VI. Educational Efforts and Public Outreach.

Inmar conducted a biennial survey of County residents, pharmacists, veterinarians and health professionals as dictated by Ordinance § 7.90.100(A)(4). The biennial survey was conducted between March 21-31, 2025. A copy of the survey was provided to the Department on April 16, 2025 and uploaded onto the Program website www.safemedicinedrop.com. A summary of the survey highlights can be found below:

Biennial Survey - Providers

Inmar completed an online survey of 100 providers to measure awareness, knowledge and attitudes amongst providers.

- 94% of providers are aware of the Program to safely dispose of unwanted/expired medication in Marin County, which is up from 78% in 2023.
- 70% of providers are aware of Mail-Back Services
- 81% of providers state that the Program is accessible
- 82% of providers state that the Program is convenient
- 74% of providers are concerned about the risks of abuse and accidental poisonings associated with improper disposal of medication.
- 90% of providers reported encouraging their patients to safely dispose of their

medications, which is consistent with 2023 survey findings.

- The largest share of providers (40%) state that their preference to receive information regarding proper drug disposal is via email and pharmacies.

Provider awareness expanded beyond general Program familiarity to specific disposal methods in 2025. Pharmacy drop box awareness reached 94%, local take-back event awareness reached 88%, and Mail-Back Service awareness increased to 70%, demonstrating broad knowledge of available disposal options.

Providers demonstrate strong awareness and support for safe medicine disposal programs in Marin County. Nearly all providers are familiar with pharmacy drop boxes (94%), and three-quarters have already encouraged patients to use disposal services, with 90% saying they are likely to do so in the future. Providers overwhelmingly view disposal programs as safe, convenient, accessible, and easy to use, with more than 80% agreeing across these measures. They also express significant concern about the risks of keeping expired or unwanted medications in homes, particularly accidental poisoning and misuse. Providers prefer receiving information through healthcare settings and email and see themselves as the most effective messengers to patients.

Biennial Survey - County Residents

Inmar completed a survey via telephone interviews and online interviews of 1,021 County residents to assess awareness and attitudes towards safe medicine disposal.

- 56% of respondents state they have either unwanted or expired medications in their home
- 68% of respondents are aware of the Program
 - 68% aware of Drop-Off Sites – 63% in 2023
 - 42% aware of take-back events – up from 3% in 2023
 - 24% aware of Mail-Back Services – up from 6% in 2023
- The most common sources of receiving information regarding the Program were healthcare providers and pharmacies (22%), email (20%), and direct mail (18%).
- 46% of respondents state they have used Drop-Off locations, which is up from 36% in 2023
- 42% of respondents state the Program is convenient
- 35% of respondents state that the Program is accessible
- 71% state that they will use the Program in the future
- Only 20% of respondents reported being concerned regarding overdose or abuse risk of improper medication disposal
- Respondents indicated that their preferred sources of information about the Program are email (18%), direct mail (17%), and pharmacies and healthcare providers (15%).

County residents continue to report having expired or unwanted medications in their homes, yet awareness of available disposal options remains limited. While two-thirds are familiar with

pharmacy drop boxes, awareness of mail-back services and take-back events is significantly lower, and only 18% recall seeing information about disposal programs in the past two years. Mail-back services, however, emerged as a key opportunity for growth in 2025. Although awareness remains modest, familiarity has increased since 2023, when only 1% of County residents reported using a mail-back service, 24% are now aware and 50% of respondents say they would consider using mail-back envelopes for medication disposal in the future. County residents generally view disposal programs positively, prefer receiving information through email, direct mail, and healthcare providers, and identify drop boxes as their preferred disposal method. These findings suggest that increased promotion of mail-back services could significantly expand participation in the Program.

The 2025 Marin County Safe Medicine Disposal surveys demonstrate meaningful progress in Program awareness, understanding, and engagement compared to 2023. The most significant gains were observed among healthcare providers, who reported higher familiarity with disposal options, strong confidence in Program accessibility and safety, and continued willingness to encourage patient participation. Among County residents, awareness of specific disposal methods increased substantially, future intent to use disposal services remains strong, and preferred communication channels are now better understood. While opportunities remain to increase overall public awareness, the 2025 findings indicate that outreach efforts are helping strengthen community knowledge and support for safe medicine disposal.

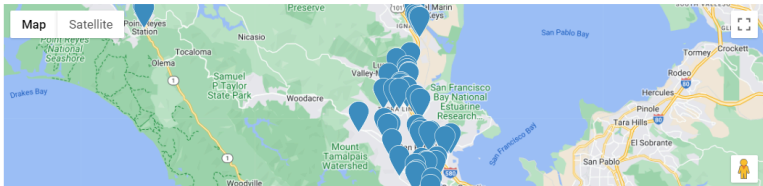

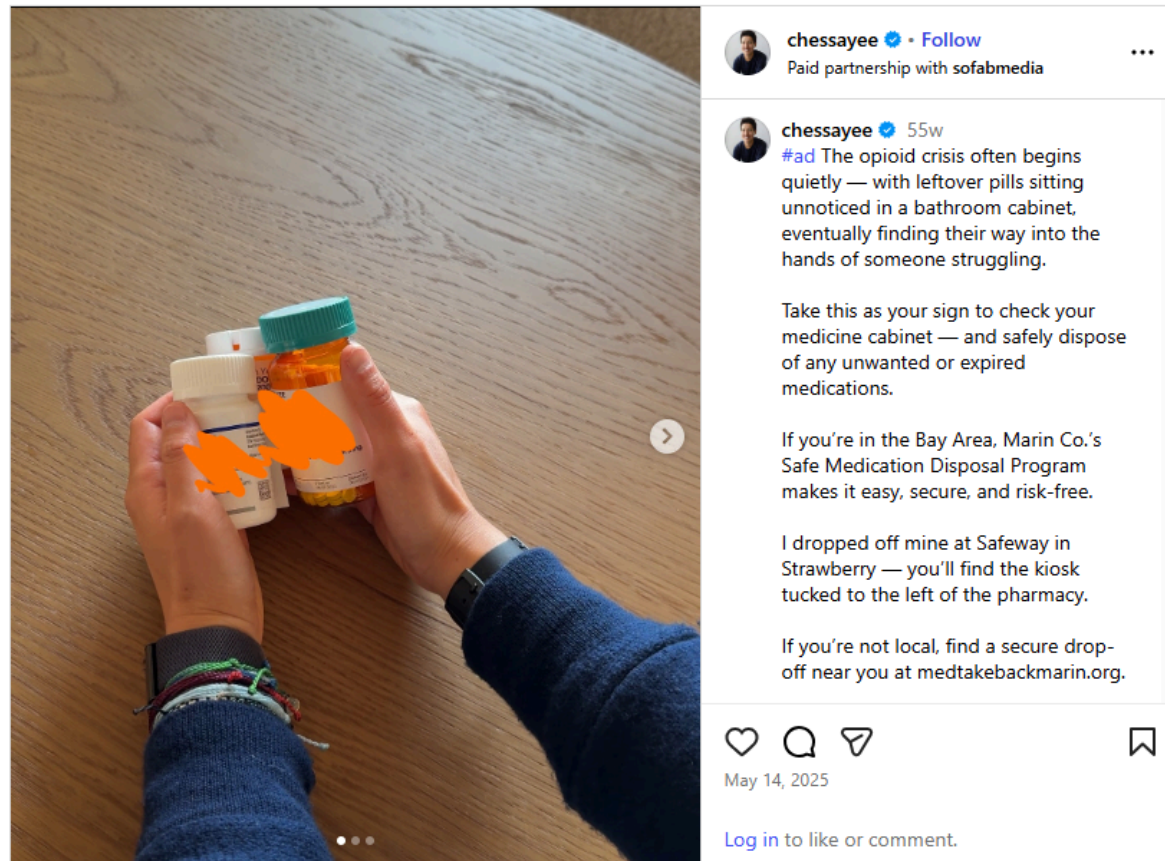
